**DEMONSTRATIONS & BATTLES AT  
OLD STURBRIDGE VILLAGE**

7-8 August 2010

The Regiment will appear for a weekend of public demonstrations and battles at Old Sturbridge Village (OSV), Sturbridge, MA. This is a major recruiting and publicity event for the Regiment and strong attendance is expected.

Uniform is No. 2 dress. Since there will be firing, muskets must be equipped with flints and hammerstalls. Line and Staff officers to wear shoes with gaiters or boots, mounted officers in boots.

The Regiment will be encamped on the Village Common in a combined Crown encampment. Bill Moss of the Royal Engineers, assisted by Michael Graves of the Tenth Regiment will direct you to the Crown encampment site and company streets.

Load-in for all camping participants begins Friday afternoon. Please check in at the registration desk near the Security and First Aid building between 1500 and 2000 hrs on Friday afternoon, August 6<sup>th</sup>. Vehicles may enter the grounds from 1715 until 2000 hrs Friday evening. Follow the one-way directions clockwise around the Common. Access and registration will also be available to the encampment from 0700 to 0900 on Saturday morning. Participants are strongly advised to arrive Friday evening if camping, as the Pan-Mass Challenge bicycle tour will be leaving from Sturbridge on Saturday morning and roads may be congested.

Public hours at Old Sturbridge Village are from 0930 to 2000 hrs on Saturday and 0930 to 1700 hrs on Sunday. 18<sup>th</sup> Century dress, appearance and demeanor should be maintained during all public hours. Any public use of cell phones, cigarettes, or other modern affectations is discouraged. All participants are welcome to tour any OSV exhibit during the hours 0930 to 1700 each day. Any entrance and egress from the Village before 0930 or after 1700 hrs should be through the Security entrance rather than the public gate.

The Regimental kitchen will be in operation through the weekend, including a “bring your own” cookout Friday evening. The Village Grill and Beer Tent will be open Friday evening.

No pets are allowed onto the Village site. All minors under 16 years of age must have adult supervision – parents, guardians or adults authorized by the parent(s) to chaperone. Water and facilities will be available at several locations nearby the Common.

Volunteers are needed for the Registration table on Friday evening and Saturday morning. Apply at the Registration table.

**Directions:**

From Boston, take Route I-90 (Mass Pike) to exit 9 onto I-84. Past the toll booth, take exit 3B onto US-20 west. Approximately 1000 feet after joining Route 20, watch for the right-side exit for OSV. This “jug handle” exit crosses Route 20 onto Stallion Hill Road. Do not take Old Sturbridge Village

Road. Once across Route 20, Bear to the right and watch for the entrance to OSV approximately 500 feet on the left. Registration will be at the upper end of the public parking lot near the Security and First Aid building.

From Maine, New Hampshire and Rhode Island, take Route I-495 to I-90 west. Follow the directions above.
